BOB RAUSCHENBERG STATEMENT USED IN AUDIO/VISUAL MONTAGE

1. All the art forms seem to be merging. There seems to be more and more a kind of an object art. My last piece of sculpture had five radio voices remote controlled. I actually thought of the sound being one of the sculptural elements. Paintings are made up of plastics, projections, images have moving parts. I mean it is really natural and only happens because here in America it's the liveliest place in the world.
2. This psychedelic business wants to facsimilate the experiences that man has under drugs. And I think that a lot of the results of the psychedelic working is really quite extraordinary, and I think it's going to give us a very rich future.
