Biographical Note

Donald Saff is an artist, art historian, and educator. In 1968 Saff founded the printmaking workshop Graphicstudio at the University of South Florida, Tampa, where he served as a Distinguished Professor and Chair of the Visual Arts Department, and as Founding Dean of the College of Fine Arts. In the early 1970s Saff worked with Rauschenberg at Graphicstudio on numerous experimental print projects.

In 1984, Rauschenberg asked Saff to serve as the Rauschenberg Overseas Culture Interchange (ROCI)'s artistic director. ROCI (pronounced "Rocky," the name of the artist's pet turtle) was inspired by Rauschenberg's belief in the power of art as a catalyst for positive social change. Funded almost entirely by the artist, Rauschenberg traveled to countries around the world often where artistic experimentation had been suppressed, with the purpose of sparking a dialogue and achieving a mutual understanding through the creative process.

In his role as ROCI's artistic director, Saff worked closely with Rauschenberg and was responsible for many aspects of the research, planning, and implementation of the project. Between 1985 and 1990, the project was realized in ten countries in the following order: Mexico, Chile, Venezuela, China, Tibet, Japan, Cuba, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), Malaysia, and Germany, with a final exhibition held in 1991 at the National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C. After ROCI was completed, in 1991 Saff established Saff Tech Arts (later Saff and Company) in Oxford, Maryland, where he collaborated with Rauschenberg to create several series in the 1990s. Saff is the author of several essays on Rauschenberg's work. In addition to their long working relationship, Saff and Rauschenberg remained friends until the artist's death in 2008.
