Arrangement: This series is arranged alphabetically by descriptive title.

Processing Information: The files in this series were found together with other papers dating from the mid-1960s to 1970, no new files were integrated into the series. The original descriptive titles and arrangement were maintained when the files were re-housed into archival folders.
